Located in Seville, this program draws upon the resources of both the University of Seville and the International College of Seville (ICS). Both border a beautiful park near the center of the city, with easy access to the many cultural and historical attractions of Seville. In addition to the historical sites such as churches, palaces and museums, Seville also has modern transportation, many hotels and restaurants, and theatres.

Founded in the sixteenth century, the University of Seville, with a student body of over 70,000, is one of the top-ranked universities in Spain. The International College of Seville (ICS), founded in 1982, is a private educational institute with its own classrooms, library, and study areas. It provides a full range of academic advising and student services, as well as numerous activities designed to complement the academic program.

Academics & Program

The International College of Seville (ICS) is a private, independent, cultural association whose basic aim is to serve as a center for the promotion of international education. The ICS was previously known as Institute of International Studies, an institution founded in 1982 and offering, in cooperation with different U.S universities and colleges and the Faculties of Philology and Geography & History at the University of Seville, a multi-faceted program for students wishing to study in Spain.

The classrooms, a reference library, TV room, Internet facilities, study areas and administrative offices occupy a three-story Andalusian villa located in the charming neighborhood of El Porvenir and next to the beautiful María Luisa park.

<u>The University of Seville</u>, founded in 1551, is one of the leading institutions of Spain's higher education system. Its Schools of Philology, Geography and History, Philosophy, Biology and Engineering and its many schools and technological institutes serve the educational needs of some 70,000 students.

Located in the downtown area, the University's main building is bordered by the Maria Luisa Park and the Guadalquivir River. This building, the completely remodeled historic Tobacco Factory, houses the Schools of Geography and

History, Philology, Law, and the main administrative offices. ICS students enrolled at the University of Seville will appreciate attending classes in the imposing 18th Century building immortalized by Bizet's opera "Carmen" and by 19th Century travellers in search of Romantic Spain.

The building, complete with moat and watchtowers, is evidence of the importance given to protecting the King's lucrative tobacco monopoly, which at the time manufactured of all of Europe's cigars.

Academic Highlights

The Intensive Spanish Language Program is four weeks in duration and provides students with an opportunity to experience and understand Spanish society and its institutions through direct exposure to Spain's history, art and contemporary society.

The program provides an excellent introduction for students planning to work in fields requiring a thorough knowledge of Spanish language and culture. Students will enjoy city visits to the Royal Alcazar Palace and Seville Cathedral, a daytrip to historic Cordoba, and an overnight trip to Morocco.

El Camino de Santiago

The Camino de Santiago is a historic pilgrimage route that leads to the cathedral of Santiago de Campostela in northwestern Spain. People from all over the world describe the Camino as life-changing, offering a rare chance to unplug, slow down, and reflect. You walk through quiet countryside, medieval villages, and beautiful landscapes—but what stays with most pilgrims is not just the scenery, it's the kindness of strangers, the deep conversations with fellow travelers, and the space to think, breathe, and heal.

Some walk the Camino to mark a transition in their lives, to process grief or burnout, to celebrate recovery or clarity. Others walk simply to experience something different and meaningful. There's no right reason—only your reason, and the path will meet you where you are.

As one person said, "I started the Camino looking for answers, but I found peace."

Whether you're seeking adventure, connection, or a sense of purpose, the Camino offers something quietly profound: the time and space to walk your way back to yourself.

Because the Camino is such a profound journey for so many, the International College of Seville has decided to incorporate this experience into an academic adventure. As a student the journey begins at the International College of Seville, where you will dive into learning about the Camino's sacred and secular histories, from the medieval pilgrimages to the modern "tourigrinos". The program is adaptable to all students and ends with a 15 day pilgrimage.

Housing

Summer students reside in homestays as the optimal way of becoming immersed in the culture. In a homestay, generally, two students are placed with a host family, along with other Spanish family members living in the apartment. Homestays provide 3 daily meals, 7 days-a-week, and laundry. All homestays are just a short walk from the ICS.

Students also have the option to stay in a student residence near the "El Porvenir" neighborhood. While this residence is a bit further away, it is no more than a 20 minute walk. Fortunately, for these students, transportation is never a problem. The municipal bus service in Seville is reliable and fairly inexpensive. Equally, the municipal bicycle service is inexpensive.

Eligibility & Deadlines

Eligibility Requirements

GPA Requirements: Students are required to have a 2.5 GPA is required

Class Standing: The program is open to students at least 18 years of age from 2 and 4-year colleges and universities throughout the US and Canada.

Visa/Immigration Requirements: Students are required to provide a copy of their unofficial transcript and a copy of their passport. A visa is not required for students who are U.S. citizens studying abroad for under 90 days. Non-U.S. nationals may be required to obtain a visa to study abroad for the summer.
